Key Vocabulary:

Carving – Cutting into or shaping solid materials such as wood

Lino print – A form of block printing that involves carving a pattern or design into a linoleum, rubber or vinyl surface that can then be printed from.

Negative space – The space around and between the subject of an image.

Block ink – A special type of ink used for block printing, a creative technique where a design is carved into a block, typically made of wood or linoleum.

What can we learn about the Vikings from their art?

Key Facts:

Vikings made excellent wood and metalwork.

They made intricate designs on silver or wood to make brooches and other jewellery.
