



Electricity

Objects are made from materials such as wood, fabric, glass, metal, cardboard, plastic or clay (Y1)

Identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals (Y1)

Explore and compare differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive (Y3)

Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants and how they depend on each other (Y3)

A habitat must provide food, shelter, water and space (Y3)
